Normandy 2024 - 80th Anniversary Tour

May 18 – June 1, 2024 15 days / 13 overnights


Day 1, Saturday, May 18, 2024

Depart the USA for Amsterdam Airport Schiphol, Netherlands (AMS) on an overnight flight with arrival the next day.

Note: If you would like to depart one day earlier you can enjoy a day of rest or do a 1-day Holland Beach tour or a 1-day Holland Tour which includes a boat ride to the famous island of Marken. The boat tour includes a visit to the famous windmills of Holland, tasting Dutch cheese, seeing how wooden shoes are being made, exploring typical fishing villages, and admiring the summer residences of the rich and famous.

Day 2, Sunday, May 19, 2024

Arrive at Amsterdam Airport Schiphol, Netherlands (AMS) and meet your tour escort. We will then transfer to our hotel with the complimentary hotel

Day 3, Monday, May 20, 2024

Today's sightseeing tour of Amsterdam will include WW2 highlights of the tumultuous history during the Second World War. Focusing on the Netherlands' role during the war, the Nazi occupation, the Dutch resistance, and the Hunger Winter, the old Jewish Quarter and memorials. Our tour will end outside the Anne Frank House, which you can visit as an option. In the late afternoon, you will



have free time to visit some of the highlights and museums of Amsterdam. Overnight Radisson Blu Hotel Amsterdam Airport, Schiphol (Breakfast)

Day 4, Tuesday, May 21, 2024

After breakfast, we depart by bus for Bruges, Belgium - one of the highlights of the tour. Bruges is one of Europe's best-preserved medieval town. Picturesque cobbled lanes, historical canals connecting the famous market squares, historical churches, and street after street historical almshouses. En route to Bruges, we will visit the **Freedom Museum** in Ramskapelle (Knokke-Heist) a museum that focuses on the liberation of West Flanders and the Battle of the Scheldt. Our main interest will be the new wing of the museum called **"Wings of Freedom"** which depicts the Battle in the air during World War 2.

After lunch, we explore **Bruges by boat on a sightseeing tour**. The Bruges canals are the arteries of the city which gives a surprising perspective, because some things you can only see from the water! After we visit Bruges, we will overnight in the nearby seaside city of Blankenberge on the Belgium coast. Our hotel will be adjacent to a historical 350-meter-long art-deco Belgium Pier, constructed in 1933.

Day 5, Wednesday, May 22, 2024

In the morning, we will take a **Sightseeing tour of Bruges** to include WW2 highlights like Michelangelo's 'Madonna and Child' statue, a fifteenth-century monument, looted in 1944 from the Church of Notre Dame in Bruges. It now sits in the Church and was represented in the 2014 film "The Monuments Men". Bruges's jaw-dropping, beautiful architecture attracts more than two million visitors every year. With its wealth of interesting old buildings and canals, it is one of the best places to visit in Europe for anyone interested in a well-preserved medieval town. Afterwards, you will have free time to visit the highlights and museums at your leisure.

Overnight Blankenberge (Bruges), Belgium (Breakfast)

Day 6, Thursday, May 23, 2024

This morning, we will visit **Dunkirk Museum 1940** "Operation Dynamo" to include a **Sightseeing tour of the Evacuation Beaches, The Port, and the British Memorial and Cemetery.**

After lunch, we depart for Dieppe, and en route, we will



visit the **Bunker of Éperlecques**, also referred to as "the Watten bunker" or simply "Watten". This is a Second World War bunker, now part of a museum, near Saint-Omer. It essentially was an assembly plant for V2 rockets. The bunker, built by Nazi Germany under the codename Kraftwerk Nord West (Powerplant Northwest) between March 1943 and July 1944, was originally intended to be a launching facility for the V-2 (A-4) ballistic missile. It was designed to accommodate over 100 missiles at a time and to launch up to 36 each day.

If the time and weather permit we will also make a short stop at the 49-meter-high cliffs of **Cap Gris-Nez** which is only 28 kilometers (18 miles) from the white cliffs of the English coast. If the weather is clear we can see the white cliffs of Dover.

Day 7, Friday, May 24, 2024

We will relive the **Battle of Dieppe** by visiting the **Dieppe Memorial of 19 August 1942 Museum** and see where the Commandos and Rangers came ashore and the bunker sites they attacked. We will also visit the Canadian beaches and spend time remembering the fallen at the Dieppe War Cemetery.

The Battle of Dieppe, also known as Operation Jubilee, was a major raid on the French coastal port of Dieppe during the Second World War. It took place on 19 August 1942 and involved 5,000 Canadians, 1,000 British troops, and 50 United States Rangers as the attacking force. The defending force consisted of German troops stationed in the area. We will also cover the **Pourville radar station account** in which

RAF Flight Sgt. Jack Nissenthall's secret role in the Dieppe Mission was long considered a catastrophic failure. It was argued that one of the real objectives of the Dieppe raid was to gather intelligence on German technology. This included an attempt to steal Germany's new four-rotor Enigma machine, as well as infiltrating a site that housed a powerful German radar, codenamed Freya, which sat atop a cliff right between Dieppe and neighboring Pourville.





Day 8, Saturday, May 25, 2024

This morning we will visit the **Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Amiens a Roman Catholic church.** The cathedral is the seat of the Bishop of Amiens. It is situated on a slight ridge overlooking the River Somme in Amiens. The cathedral was built almost entirely between 1220 and c. 1270, a remarkably short period of time for a Gothic cathedral, giving it an unusual unity of style and a good example of the High Gothic style of Gothic architecture. It also has some features of the later Rayonnant style in the enlarged high windows of the choir, added in the mid-1250s. Amiens Cathedral is the largest in France, 260,000 cubic yards, large enough to contain two cathedrals the size of Notre Dame of Paris. The cathedral has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1981.

In the afternoon we depart for Normandy and en route visit the city of **Rouen and its Cathedral**. During World War II, in 1940–1944, the town was occupied by Germany. Rouen was heavily damaged during the war – approximately 45% of the city was destroyed. In June 1940, the area between the Rouen Cathedral and the Seine River burned for 48 hours. Other areas were destroyed between March and August 1944, just before and during the Battle of Normandy, which ended on the left bank of the Seine with the destruction of several regiments belonging to the German 7th Army. Rouen's cathedral and several significant monuments were damaged by Allied bombing. During the German occupation, Nazi Germany's Kriegsmarine had its headquarters located in a château and the SS operated a subcamp of the V SS construction brigade in the city. Around 500 prisoners, were used as slave labor to build launching bases for the V-1 and V-2 rockets.

Day 9, Sunday, May 26, 2024

This morning, we will attend the Memorial Day Service at the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial. After lunch, we visit Pointe du Hoc Ranger Monument, Longues-sur-Mer Battery, and Musee Du Debarquement (D-Day Museum Arromanches) before returning to our hotel.


Day 10, Monday, May 27, 2024

A full-day program to cover the **Normandy American Sector** is planned for today. Some of the highlights include **St. Marcouf / Crisbacq Battery, Utah Beach, Brecourt Manor, St Mere Eglise and Airborne Museum, Carentan Causeway, and Battle of Graignes.**

This morning, we depart for the **Normandy British Sector.** Some of the highlights will include **Battery Merville and Museum, Pegasus Bridge and Museum.** In the late afternoon, we will depart for Mont St. Michel. 2 overnights Mont-Saint-Michel (Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 12, Wednesday, May 29, 2024

Today, we will discover the medieval city and the **Abbey of Mont St. Michel with a local professional guide**. The Mont-Saint-Michel architecture and its bay are the most visited tourist sites of Normandy. In 1874 it was classified as a historical monument and since 1979 it has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Today, we depart for Paris. En route, we will tour **Rommel's headquarters "Chateau de LA ROCHE-GUYON"** before arriving at our hotel in Paris.
